My heart is both heavy and encouraged at the same time following the extended Zoom conversation that I just had with our WGM Global Worker in northeast Nigeria named Pat. It's heavy from hearing of the ethnic conflict that has recently erupted in the community where Pat ministers, resulting in homes being burned down, and people being attacked and killed, including a man Pat had employed as a night watchman for the compound where she stays and serves. As you would imagine, many in the community are living in fear right now!

As soon as I heard the news of the guard's death last Sunday, I reached out to WGM's Member Health Department personnel and asked them to connect with Pat, which they promptly did. Today, as we talked, Pat shared how much that meant to her and how thankful she was for the resources that were shared with her to help her process the traumatic events. She went on to say how she is happy to now be able to share them with the women in her "living learning community" group, as well as the wife of the former watchman, to help them through this challenging time as well. Now you can understand why my heart is also encouraged in the midst of these difficult circumstances. Pat is living out 2 Corinthians 1:3-5 (ESV), which says,

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too.

Pat is sharing intimately in the afflictions of the community of Karim Lamido, and in their comfort as well. I find it fitting that Pat's closest colleague and friend in that community is named...Comfort!

Waking up to gunshots on Saturday morning, she had to flee, along with others, to the local pastor's house seeking the added protection in numbers and being in proximity to a religious leader who is less likely to be attacked. That pastor, her friend Comfort, and other trusted friends then advised Pat to return to Jalingo, her home base near her sister, which she was able to do. *Please be praying for Pat in Jalingo as well as her friends in Karim Lamido, Nigeria!* 

I can hardly believe that as I write this, we're halfway through 2023! Where has this year gone? Although I can't answer that question, I *can* answer the question, "Where have *we* gone this year?"



### July 4, 2023

We began the year in Wilmore, Kentucky, but returned to Kenya in mid-February in the middle of an unusual outpouring of God's Spirit at Asbury University, just a few blocks from our home there. Jon was privileged to attend one chapel service just before we left. World Gospel Mission student center staff were present throughout the event to counsel and pray with students as they shared the sacred experience together.
