ADULT EDUCATION AT WFMC ADULT BIBLE FELLOWSHIP CLASSES: WHAT ARE THEY?

ABF stands for a group of **Adults**, gathering to study the **Bible**, and working toward developing **Fellowship** in community. The Adult Bible Fellowship offerings are long-term, ongoing classes—most of varying-age members—designed to provide a place for learning, discussion, and relationship and community building.

If you are looking for a place where you can know and be known by others, connect yourself to an ABF. If you are looking for a place to learn and grow, connect yourself to an ABF. If you are looking for a group of people who will care about you, connect yourself to an ABF.

Adult Electives are occasional offerings that help supplement our adult Christian education experience. Electives are short-term classes (up to one year) that cover specific material. They are not designed to provide the pastoral care and social elements that ABFs do. Often, people choose to be connected permanently to ABFs while occasionally taking advantage of electives. Electives are announced in the weekly worship folder, two weeks prior to the start date.

CAFÉ BEREA ROOM B100 + ZOOM

Café Berea takes its name from Acts 17:11 where it is said that the people of Berea “received the message with great eagerness and searched the Scriptures daily.” The focus of the class is direct study of the Scripture. Class members volunteer (not required) to bring breakfast snacks. The present study is of the book of John. Dr. John Oswalt is the teacher. Study questions are passed out in advance, and class discussion is an important feature. Glen Ellwood opens the class with a devotional thought and leads in prayer for requests that have been voiced. Later in the week, Nancy Ellwood sends out the list of requests so that we can continue to be connected with one another. The class meets in B100 and is also Zoom-connected.

EXPLORERS ROOM B104

Quilting, Marvel superheroes, Van Gogh’s *Starry Night*, *Fiddler on the Roof*, this year’s Oscars, Dr. King’s *Letter from a Birmingham Jail* – such are the topics kickstarting the conversations in Explorers. We look at the intersection of what our culture is saying and how the Bible and Christian tradition address those same issues, so that we can better hear our neighbors, better speak to the concerns of the day, and better understand how God is moving in our world. HOMEBUILDERS ROOM B201

The vision of the Homebuilders ABF is to study how God’s Word speaks practically to present-day families. Each week the class begins with fellowship over breakfast, followed by a time of prayer. The study portion of class alternates between Bible book studies and topical studies. The class hosts monthly fellowship opportunities for members and their families to get together. Ben Riffell leads this ABF.

LAYMAN’S CLASS ROOM B200

Layman’s ABF is attended by singles and marrieds in age ranges from the 30’s to the 90’s. This is a Bible class, and our study is interactive, with a focus on what the Scriptures have to say to Christians living in a world that looks more and more like it must have looked in the first century. Teaching responsibilities are shared among Dale Hale, Allen Holmes, John Swaim and Larry Winkleman.

ONPURPOSE ROOM B105

The OnPurpose ABF (20- to 30-somethings, post-high-school/early career), led by Don & Jennifer Fairbairn and Ralph & Linda Clark. The On-Purpose ABF will kick off the Fall by studying the Trinity. We will gain a panoramic view of the Christian faith by looking at the role of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in creation and redemption, and we’ll consider how we can reflect the Trinity in the way we live our Christian lives.
