





# Intentional Prayer – for the Whole Person

## Prayer Training and Discussion Class

Beginning **September 2, 2025**, an opportunity for anyone interested in deepening their understanding and practice of intentional prayer

## Topics and Focus

Participants will explore practical approaches to prayer, such as:

- Discovering true identity in Christ—learning to cast all worries and anxieties upon the Lord, who cares deeply (see 1 Peter 5:7).
- Receiving God’s peace, love, and acceptance in areas previously marked by rejection.
- Praying for healing—whether physical, emotional, or spiritual—for oneself and for others, seeking restoration through Jesus.

## Class Details

This nine-week course meets weekly for two hours each Tuesday evening at **WFMC, Room B203**, from **6:30 to 8:30 pm**, running from **September 2 through October 28**.

## Leadership and Format

The class is co-led by Lee Taylor, WFMC Prayer Team leader, and by Joyce Underwood. The format combines instructional teaching with open discussion, encouraging both learning and active participation.
