A Word About May 20: You've probably heard Governor Beshear's announcement that houses of worship may be "open" on May 20. What you may not have heard is the list of requirements for those openings to occur, including temperature checks, masks, 6' social distancing, and many others.

Apparently, the guidelines for churches are still being worked out and we are to expect more information from the KY Health Department on all that in the days to come. At this point, I am in contact with the health department and with our Board of Administration and Staff to determine if the ancillary requirements make it at all feasible for a church of our size to gather in-person.

We all very much want things to be 'back to normal.' For today though, let me simply say, please don't assume anything will be in any way 'back to normal' on May 20 simply because of the Governor's statement...or June 20 or July 20 for that matter. Even when we are able to return to in-person gatherings, things will be very different for many more weeks.

As I receive information and as the staff and BOA reach some decisions, I'll certainly keep you informed. We want to gather in person, but we want to do that safely and in accordance with those who lead us.
