Notes on Re-Gathering: This Monday, May 25, begins the lifting of restrictions for groups of up to ten to meet together, presuming social distancing. This means that groups ten and under can begin meeting once again on church property as well as in homes. As your church-related group (of ten or fewer persons) restarts in-person meetings, know that the church campus is open to you. We'd ask that you'd please let the office know your meeting intentions.

Technically, the Church is Not Really Re-opening on June 14....since that language presumes that we closed...which we did not. If the closure of a building stops the church from being the church, then we're in trouble. And it didn't, because we've heard of the many ministries and examples of Christ that our church family has been through these last weeks.

As I mentioned in Wednesday's Pastor's Update, we'll be releasing our plans next week for in-person worship to begin on June 14. There are still details the staff has to iron out, but we know this much:

- 1) It will be very good to be together again
- 2) We will miss those who really need to worship from home, but we do understand
- 3) We will need volunteer teams to do some cleaning, directing...that sort of thing – email the office if you'll help
- 4) The whole experience will be different for a while, and we need to prepare ourselves for that
- 5) The way we gather on June 14 won't last forever – changes will be happening, perhaps even week by week
